UNCONVENTIONAL FORMS OF SUPERCONDUCTIVITY AND QUANTUM CRITICALITY IN HEAVY-ELECTRON METALS

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Some recent observations made on the isostructural compounds CeCu₂Si₂ and YbRh₂Si₂ are discussed. We first address the interplay of superconductivity in CeCu₂Si₂ with both a spin-density-wave-type quantum critical point (QCP) at low pressure [O. Stockert et al., PRL **92**, 136402 (2004)] and a weak valence transition of Ce at high pressure [H. Q. Yuan et al., Science **302**, 2104 (2003)]. We then turn to YbRh₂Si₂ displaying a novel type of QCP [J. Custers et al., Nature **424**, 524 (2003); S. Paschen et al., Nature **432**, 881 (2004)], which appears to be detrimental to superconductivity.
